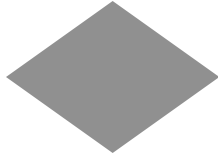


DONATIONS OF REAL PROPERTY

OTHER EXPERIENCES

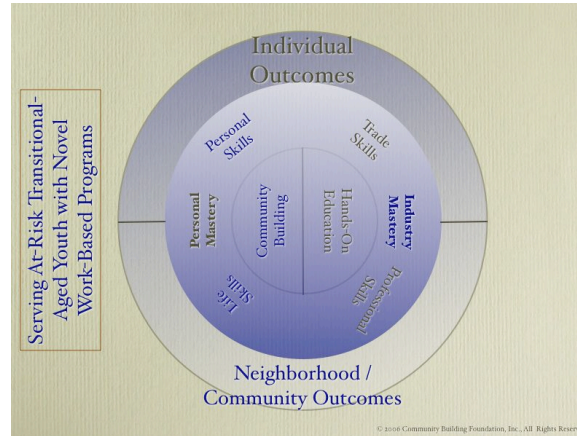

Our apprentices receive, close and intensive supervision. On the job training in the trades is augmented with classroom-type work. Readings. Computer work (planning, timetables, materials) and, most important of all, practicing a new kind of communication that encourages authenticity and promotes ever-deepening communication.

- A life-skills school for under-served young adults and people in challenging neighborhoods.
- Teaching new skills in an intensive, close ratio and providing a new way to be with other human beings.
- Creating a new language and easy ways to follow some new rules for communicating that deepen connections.

MISSION

CBF, Inc., a non-profit community-based educational Foundation providing life skills to underserved young adults as they are trained and paid to restore neglected homes. Their work, coupled with a neighborhood communications program, works as a model to revitalize neighborhoods, transforming them into caring communities.

HOW WILL CBF, INC. CONDUCT ITS WORK?

CBF's program aims to reduce attraction for gang activity and counterproductive behaviors by giving disadvantaged youth (17-21 years in age) jobs as paid apprentices on construction projects -- new buildings, rehabs and remodels. In a close mentor-
